Woodhull Hospital, Brooklyn NY 2014

Ongoing research. Retrospective study looking that the incidence of colon cancer/ polyps over the past 5 years detected on screening and diagnostic colonoscopy. The incidence is thought to be underreported based on observation of high polish population that seeks medical care at Woodhull. If proven to be true these patients would warrant earlier screening colonoscopy.

Patients are interviewed and charts reviewed to assess patients' knowledge of procedure, risks and benefits prior to procedure date. Dr. Thet 4/1/08- 5/09. Retrospective study of incidents involving heparin induced thrombocytopenia in patients receiving deep venous thrombosis prophylaxis. Study examines patient's initial presentation, length of hospital stay, comorbidities and complications due to HIT to better analyze potentially modifiable factors contributing to heparin induced thrombocytopenia.
